

# Woman Helped Daughter Cheat Urine Test

**NEW BRIGHTON** — A New Brighton woman has confessed that she was providing urine for her daughter to pass drug tests, according to a Beaver County detectives report.

Tracy Boring, 36, of 1330 Fourth Ave. now faces two counts of tampering with evidence and one count of corruption of minors for helping her 16-year-old daughter.

According to a report by Beaver County Detective Timmie Patrick, the 16-year-old, who wasn't named, is on probation with Beaver County's juvenile services division. The report didn't indicate why.

As part of her probation, Patrick said, the girl had to submit to periodic drug tests, which were done between Jan. 19 and March 10.

Patrick said that initially, the girl had her 5-year-old sibling provide her urine, but her mother stepped in and provided urine twice.

Patrick said that on March 11, juvenile services probation officer Charles Rossi told him that he got a phone call from Tracy Boring, in which she confessed to supplying urine for her daughter's drug test so that the daughter could pass the test.

Patrick's report said that Boring said her daughter wasn't listening to her anymore and she had no other option but to confess so that juvenile services could again intervene with her daughter.

Patrick said he interviewed Tracy Boring on April 15, and she explained how her urine samples were concealed on her daughter's body so that she could pass them off as her own during the drug tests.

Tracy Boring couldn't be reached for comment Wednesday.
